

#### Background

The Development Partners Working Group on Decentralisation and Local Governance (DPWG-LGD) was established in recognition of the prominent role these issues play in overall Public Sector Reforms and Poverty Reduction Strategy processes in many developing countries. A first planning workshop took place on the 26<sup>th</sup> of April, 2006 in Frankfurt, as a joint initiative of KfW and the European Commission. Since its inception, membership of the DPWG has increased significantly. Annual meetings have been held in Brussels 2006, Berlin 2007, Paris 2008, Bratislava 2009 and Washington 2010. Despite its informal character DPWG-LGD has consolidated itself as the reference group for donor harmonisation in the field of LGD. This continuity has as well been possible through the establishment of a secretariat at the beginning of 2008 funded by BMZ and hosted by InWEnt, now GIZ.

In 2008 the group approved general guiding principles for enhancing alignment and harmonisation on local governance and decentralisation, that where complemented in 2009 with specific guiding principles to provide more practical guidance at the field level. In this regard the first American based annual meeting in Washington in June last year has been focusing on identifying key purposes and challenges from improved donor coordination, highlighting practical tools and approaches to achieving greater coherence in country engagements. Three case studies on DRC, Indonesia and Uganda have been presented that provided valuable insights on the challenges of harmonisation on the county level within the DLG sector.

Based on the outcomes of the Washington meeting, the secretariat elaborated a work-plan that is focusing on using the country cases as an "evidence based advocacy tool" to be presented at the 4<sup>th</sup> High Level Forum on Aid Effectiveness in Busan, South Korea at the end of 2011. The initial 3 case studies are going to be complemented by 4 additional ones, Benin, Mozambique and Peru funded by EuropeAid and Ghana funded by France. In January 2011 a synthesis paper on the existing case studies has been finalised that provides valuable inputs for the publication.

Further on the work-plan is also aiming at consolidating the other core issues DPWG-LGD has been working on since its establishment, being this capacity development, fiscal decentralisation and the elaboration of concrete instruments to improve harmonisation and alignment. Studies on capacity development and fiscal decentralisation have been produced as well as a training course under train4dev on harmonisation, decentralisation and local governance is being developed. So during the annual meeting it is foreseen to further work on these areas to determine future activities of the group.

#### **Objectives**

The general objective of the 6<sup>th</sup> annual meeting is to take stock of the activities of the group carried out in 2011 and explore ways forward to make donor support more effective.

This year a special focus will be given to the publication in preparation for the Fourth High Level Forum on Aid Effectiveness to be held on 29 Nov. – 1 Dec. 2011 in Busan. The publication will focus on the Paris Declaration and Accra principles and will look at the extent to beneficiary countries and donors have found ways to increase ownership, used mechanisms to align and harmonise aid for decentralisation, and used results-based frameworks and mutual accountability mechanisms.

The meeting will also be an opportunity for donors and other participants to share good practices and experiences related to DLG. Especially issues such as the dynamics between decentralisation and sector programmes, fiscal decentralisation and how to measure the results and impact of decentralisation will be considered.

Consequently, the agenda will be articulated as follows:

- Days 1 and 3 will be used to push forward several issues of interest for the group members. Different sessions will allow participants to present studies, tools and any other relevant material to improve donor support in the DLG area.
- Day 2 will be fully dedicated to the presentation and discussion of the DPWG-LGD flagship publication. A presentation of the publication will be made in order to inform all group members about the process and the results achieved. Then working groups will be organised in order to discuss, amend and improve the recommendations made by the study. This should allow us internalising and enriching the conclusions of the study.

In addition to donor organisations, the participation of aid recipients, representatives of local authorities and the academic community will be encouraged to benefit from the inputs of a wide range of stakeholders.
